Karlsruhe, September 21, 1924

Dear Professor,

Since I missed you several times, I would like to inform you that I must travel to Carlsbad and Vienna for one week. The first trip has to do with the Mannheim affair, which I told you about, while the latter trip is to visit my relatives. I'll return on September 28th, if not sooner.

I have taken the liberty of sending you an overview of the useful applications of the X-ray method, in which I have noted in red pencil those points which I would like to consider working on.

- 1) An Examination of Manganese Oxides (diploma thesis, partly X-ray based)
- 2) An Examination of Chrome Plating Methods (diploma thesis)
- 3) An Examination of the Structure of X-rays (Dissertation)
- 4) Studies on Diffusion in Solid Materials, especially of Metalloids in Iron (annealing, case hardening), (Dissertation)
